# Gas station vote delayed

Commissioners postpone controversial hearing, but offer hope that Florida Forever may buy the property

Hundreds of people showed up from around the region to express their concerns about a proposed gas station to be located near known underground caves that flow to Wakulla Springs. But only 95 people could get into the county commission chambers, leaving about 150 people to swelter in the heat outside.

After 30 minutes, expressing concern about the citizens outside, the county commission voted unanimously to postpone the controversial comp plan amendment for another day and another venue.

And then Commission Chairman Ralph Thomas dropped the bombshell that he has been working with state Rep. Jason Shoaf (R-Port St. Joe) to try the land purchased by the Florida Forever Fund.

The commission meeting room was full and an overflow of about 150 people were forced to stay outside. Complaints about heat and not being able to hear the meeting outside like commissioners to postpone the controversial issue.

Thomas was optimistic about the possibility.

Some citizens were too. Eugene Watkins, usually a harsh critic of the commission, called it a "glorious moment."

Some citizens, such as Kellie Keys and

former commissioner Lynn Artz, suggested that if the state did buy the land it would be perfect as a park with exhibits explaining the underground cave system or a welcome center for Wakulla.

Other citizens ex-

pressed support, but warned that the state's money for land buying has been cut and not to count too much on that solution.

One citizen, Claudia Sperber of Tallahassee, said she was "profoundly supportive" of the land being

purchased by the state but worried it's not guaranteed.

Southwest Georgia Oil Co., which operates Inland gas stations, has proposed a 16-pump station and car wash at the corner of U.S. Highway 319 and Bloxham Cutoff.

Controversy arises from the fact that the Wakulla Karst Plain Project, which studies the underground cave connections, has mapped a tunnel under portions of the property that flows directly to Wakulla Springs.

How to protect the underground cave system has been the crux of the controversy.

Southwest Georgia had first made the proposal a year ago, it was voted down by the planning commission and then the company withdrew it in February right before it was to be heard by county commissioners. Then-county commissioner Randy Merritt announced that he would have had no choice but to vote for the gas station and charged staff to find a legal basis to vote no.

Staff initially thought of setbacks from the underground caves, but the caves are 100 to 200 feet underground and there's

## Welding facility to be named for late Roscoe Grant

The Wakulla County School Board voted 4-1 to name the Wakulla High School welding facility after longtime vocational instructor Roscoe Grant.

The vote, at the school board's July 24 meeting, was supported by Chair Melisa Taylor, and members Josh Brown, Cale Langston and Laura Lawhon. School board member Eddie Hand cast the lone dissenting vote, but did not explain why. Hand did question Superintendent Bobby Pearce about what other school facilities are named for people – and Pearce pointed to numerous athletic facilities: the football field and stadium, the track, the baseball field, and the tennis courts.

Pearce also praised Grant for his work on Wakulla vocational programs and credited his work with bringing in \$20 million in new vocational funding for the high school from Triumph Gulf Coast.

Grant was 66 years old when he died on June 9, 2023.

Grant's teaching at Wakulla High was through an agreement with Lively Vo-Tech in Tallahassee.

## Helping overcome addiction

Promise Land Ministries aims to help substance abuse recovery in Wakulla

Promise Land Ministries, located at 20 Church Road, close to Shell Point, is a faith-based recovery center. Pastor Glen Hamel and his wife Vera, have devoted their lives to serving the rejected, hurting, abused, and addicted.

Pastor Glen also leads Real Church, a non-denominational church located at 3167 Coastal Highway in Crawfordville.

Ed Layton, now Executive Director to Promise Land and Yard Services

Manager, was once in the transition program for men himself. Proudly, Layton shared his testimony to show others overcoming addiction can be done.

"I went into the Program in 2008," Layton says. "When I came to Promise Land, I was living on the streets, I had issues and problems functioning, I was on drugs, on alcohol, I lost everything – I was tired of it. After going through detox, I reached out to Glen.

"I originally planned on hanging out in the ministry long enough to get myself together and I

was going to leave, just like an addict would, get a few meals in my stomach and go," Layton says. "But something happened, I found myself happy with the ministry, I was content, I was happy, the structure of the ministry is something I needed. I was in a place where people cared about me. I got so involved with the ministry, I graduated the program in 8 months.

"After being involved, doors opened, and I dedicated myself to Jesus. Where I once thought I wouldn't be able to make it, I know now that life will always have its bumps, but this time,

I know I will be able to make it through because of Jesus."

Not only does Promise Land help men struggling with addiction, the ministry also gives back to the community by offering donation-based food banks, yard care – such as underbrush cleaning, clearing such as picking up leaves and sticks and mowing.

Jobs requiring carpentry, small home repairs, handy man jobs, painting, porch repair and house painting are services also available.

"When you see someone receive good things

# Purple passionflower

Purple passionflower (*Passiflora incarnata*) is a native vine that can climb or sprawl. Its large, fantastical fringed flowers could have been drawn by Dr. Seuss. Its 3-lobed leaves feed the voracious caterpillars of numerous butterflies, including gulf fritillary, zebra longwing, crimson patch longwing, and red-banded hairstreak. Flowers are followed by a green, leathery fruit that turns yellow when ripe and “pops” when crushed. Ripened maypops can be eaten or made into jelly. Purple passionflower is a rambunctious climber, and its roots can spread aggressively. One of six *Passiflora* species native to Florida, purple passionflower grows in much of the state. However, numerous cultivars and non-natives are sold, sometimes as native. Purple passionflower can be found near the west picnic pavilion at Sopchoppy Depot Park.

Purple passionflower's maypops are edible.



no way for a surveyor above ground to put up stakes with red flags to demarcate where the edge of the tunnel is and thus where the setback would begin.

The county staff and a consultant came up with a proposed ordinance that would require more soil testing and other work on sites, and that would look at the location of gas underground storage tanks.

County Administrator David Edwards told commissioners that, in a meeting with attorneys with the general counsel of state Department of Environmental Protection, he and other county officials were told that the county could not preempt state regulation of storage tanks. The meeting was also attended by County Attorney Heather Encinosa and

other county staff.

The county ended up dropping the ordinance.

After some DEP officials denied they stopped the county's ordinance, Edwards has been lambasted in some state media for allegedly lying to commissioners.

Some citizens groups got together and tried to write an ordinance to protect the underground cave systems, but commissioners rejected it, saying it relied on ordinances from other counties that have setbacks from aboveground features – cave openings, for example – but did not solve the problem of how to do a setback from something 100 to 200 feet underground.

But the way commissioners rejected it drew some scorn: At the meeting on July 17, Commissioner Chuck Hess made a motion to approve, and Chairman Thomas asked

for a second or a second for discussion and none of the other three commissioners would make such a motion.

When the matter died for a lack of second, citizens erupted in anger – many yelling and pointing fingers, there was

a brief sit-in, and three people were escorted out by a deputy, including Jack Rudloe of Gulf Specimen Marine Lab in Panacea. (Rudloe had his no trespass order lifted and was able to attend the commission meeting on Monday, Aug. 4.)

At Monday night's meeting, county officials were well-aware that the matter would draw a crowd and that the meeting room size is limited. (Edwards had told the Sun last week that there was possibility that the meeting could be moved

to the community center if the crowd was big. That didn't happen because the attorney noted that some items on the agenda had been noticed for the commission chambers, not the community center.)

Ninety-five people were allowed in, counted off by Fire Chief Louis Lamarche, and everybody else had to stay out in the heat.

County staff had set up several tents, there was cold water and a big fan. TV monitors had been set up to provide those outside with a way to follow what was happening inside.

But commissioners called a recess 30 minutes into the meeting out of concern for what was happening outside, and they unanimously agreed to postpone the gas station issue and hold it at a later date in a larger venue, presumably the community center.

It's not clear when the matter will be reset.

like a cut lawn or elderly people with yards in despair and look like a jungle, when I see the happy on their face and tears in their eyes, I know I am doing the right thing and what Jesus wants me to do.

"If I hadn't come to Promise Land and stayed, then I would probably be dead," Layton says. "I thank God first and foremost. I turned 64 years old and I wasted 40 years on drugs and alcohol, but now I put forth the effort, the desire to uphold the code of conduct and I quit smoking, are all good things I never thought I could do.

"I am now licensed to minister, I am just blessed, and I now have joy, happiness, acceptance and love," he says.

To be a part of the Program, the men submit to a 32-week discipleship program with the first 2 weeks being

orientation, they are in a "cut off" period from outside influences and past habits. The next step is welcome family to visit and support the new sober lifestyle while attending church together. Furlough services are offered and there is no total isolation. Phone calls are allowed and love is encouraged.

Promise Land said, "We found a lot of support in Wakulla County and without the Community, we wouldn't be here. We are here to please God, serve God and serve our community. It lifts you up to know we are serving and that the people appreciate it, we are obedient vessels to do God's work." Promise Land is a whole-life recovery ministry that has helped countless individuals find freedom through Christ.

## HOME ON THE RANGE

### Freedom Arms' belt buckle gun

I see my old friend "Hobart" in a local store.

"Hi!" he says. "I like to read your articles."

Of course, that's nice to hear.

"You might want to write about belt buckles which hold .22 revolvers."

"Really? Someone makes belt buckles with revolvers in them?"

"Yes, really. Originally, a kind of buckle gun was made by the Nazis in World War II. The gun was built into the buckle. It could be made with 1-4 barrels: kind of like a derringer.

"Later, Freedom Arms made a belt buckle .22 5-shot revolver, and they were single action only. These mini revolvers were called the "Patriot" model.

"North American Arms took over this belt buckle design and still makes them today.

"My dad did many things: one of which was owning his own gun shop, so I've shot many guns in the past."

"You, Hobart?" He's one of the last people I'd think would ever own or shoot a gun. He grins and nods.

Well, a revolver in a belt buckle? I have to look this up. And ask Joe, of course. You never know what he has read.

First, I look up this buckle on Wikipedia.

"Freedom Arms' mini revolvers were the first to use the "belt buckle" holster. If this rings a bell, it is because after Freedom Arms ceased production of their mini revolver, North American Arms bought the design and continues to produce such firearms."

Of these were:

The "Patriot" 5-shot revolver which was Chambered in .22LR. It could have a 1 inch, 1.75 inch or 3 inch barrel, but the belt buckle came with only the 1 inch barrel.

Another version was the "Ironsides" 4-shot revolver. It came in a .22WMR (magnum), also with 1 inch, 1.75 inch, or 3 inch barrel. Again, the belt buckle version was only in the 1 inch barrel.

I ask Joe: "OK, this is pretty cool. And I see the photo of the buckle. The gun looks real! But is there some sort of swing mechanism that holds the gun behind the metal impression of the gun?"

"No," says Joe. "What you are seeing is the actual gun. The buckle acts as a holster. Initially made by Freedom Arms in Freedom, Wyoming, the design was licensed to North American Arms in 1990.

"Since these revolvers are single action only, you have to cock the hammer each time you shoot. And, I think you'd have some recoil, even though it's a .22LR. The gun is very light, so there is hardly any mass to absorb recoil, and the grip is so tiny that the revolver will be difficult to manage."

Jeremy S, on The Truth About Guns, has

fired one of these tiny .22s.

"They may only be .22s, but due to the tiny size and light weight they're pretty lively. Mine kicks and snaps a little and often rotates slightly in my grip. There's noise, blast, and usually some fireball from the muzzle."

He continues: "While the gun (based on other tests I've seen) is actually mechanically accurate to a higher degree than you'd likely expect, in practice it's really hard to line it up consistently for each shot. Obviously the lack of a rear sight is a contributing factor, but so are the extremely short sight radius and the teeny grip."

Like Hobart had told me, these little revolvers are not distance guns: they are more for when someone was right next to you.

The Truth About Guns (TTAG) Dan Zimmerman agrees and adds: "If you want to

quick-draw and point-shoot this little revolver, you're going to need to be really close to the target which, considering the nature of this revolver, is probably one of the best ways to employ it. This is primarily an emergency/backup/'get off me' gun."

How does Dan sum it up?

"I like it a lot. I do keep in mind what it is, what it's made for, and I don't try to make it out to be something better than it really is. I think it's a marvel of craftsmanship, I think it's a tremendous collector's item, I think it's a great conversation starter, and I think it's the ultimate extreme-deep-concealment backup gun. I wouldn't advise it as a primary defensive weapon, but even if you did have to employ it in that capacity, it's nice to know that (with the right ammo) it may actually be able to deliver

the lead necessary.

"I'd like to give it five stars, but the ergonomics knocked one off. Within the context of what this is designed to be (a tiny, ultra-concealable gun), I think it hits a home run."

"The belt holster gun sounds really cool," I tell Hobart, "but what about the ability to wear this revolver in Florida? Not being able to show it off sort of misses the point, doesn't it?"

"Sure," Hobart agrees. "You can carry it without a concealed carry permit, but it does have to be concealed."

True. In Florida, you can use the gun and belt as a backup weapon if need be, and you can hold up your pants, but you have to hide the buckle and gun behind a sweat-shirt or other piece of clothing so the gun doesn't imprint.

I'd like to see and shoot one of these tiny

revolvers despite recoil and noise. I'd like to see one in the belt buckle holster too. In fact, you can find the belt buckle holsters on eBay! I saw one Freedom Arms holster (without revolver) in solid brass for \$325, and one from North American Arms for \$99.

I saw the whole assembly on Guns.com for \$341.99.

"The North American Arms Mini Revolver offers good performance in a reliable, durable, and small revolver design. It comes chambered in .22LR with a 1.125-inch barrel. Features include wood grips, a belt buckle and a 5-round capacity."

So really. What good is the holster without the revolver?

## BIRDING AT THE REFUGE

### Brave the heat for August birding

August at St. Marks NWR serves to transition the refuge from the lethal heat of July into the sullen heat of September. August needs to be endured if we are ever to reach the faintly-remembered cool weather of Fall.

It was already in the low 80s as I walked out the Double Dikes under a mostly-full moon. I was trying to get to the end of the dike before sunrise. The Eastern sky was painted in swaths of pink and pale smoky blue. Pig Frogs were grunting randomly from the marshes along the dike and the large white blooms of pine hibiscus stood out in the predawn light.

I had scared off a Great Horned Owl as I pulled in to park and added a calling Least Bittern and two fly-by Wood Ducks to my list, while slapping at hordes of mosqui-

toes and biting flies. I walked out on the North dike. It is higher and has better marsh views. It can be good for nightbirds like rails, owls, and night-hawks. My plan was to return on the South dike. It parallels the North dike and would bring me back to my car. Also, it's lower and would provide a good vantage point for shorebirds on Stony Bayou.

I made it out just before sunrise and set my scope up to scan Stony Bayou. Yellow Warblers were moving through the brush along the edge of the dikes. Yellow Warblers are a common Fall migrant at the refuge. They start coming through in July and won't finish passing through until early November. Out on the Stony Bayou mudflats there were scattered waders, Great Blue, Little Blue & Tricolored Herons along

with Great and Snowy Egrets. A large group of Roseate Spoonbills were gathered around two white pelicans. The spoonbills and pelicans have been hanging out together for a few weeks. There was also a flamingo.

I walked back along the dike scoping for shorebirds. They were widely scattered. I found Black-bellied, Wilson's and Semipalmated Plovers. Two of the black-bellies were in breeding plumage, indicating early migrants back from the arctic. There were Short-billed Dowitchers, Willets, both Greater & Lesser Yellowlegs, as well as, Least and Semipalmated Sandpipers. I found a single Stilt Sandpiper, another early migrant passing through from the Arctic on its way to South America for the winter.

If you brave the heat, you will see seasonal change occurring at

St. Marks. Partridge Pea is in flower and the first ripening berries of Virginia Creeper are attracting Mockingbirds. Migratory Black Saddlebag dragonflies have shown up. Come early and you may even see a bobkitten following its mother. Life is in full progress at St. Marks, despite the heat.

August at St. Marks is hot and there are biting insects. However, there are also late-summer wildflowers and every day brings new migrant birds. Horsemint will start blooming this month and both Bald Eagles and Blue-winged Teal will return later in the month.

If you must endure August, you might as well come down to the refuge. Don't worry, August never lasts more than a month..

SOUTHERN FLOUNDER  
(*Paralichthys lethostigma*)

Flounders are a type of "flat fish". As the young larvae develop, one eye migrates across the head so both end up on the same side. They lie flat, eyes up, and can change their color to blend in. They hide from predators and ambush small fish prey with their studded teeth. They are tolerant of temperatures from 50-90F and salinities of 0-36 ppt. They weigh from 1-2 lbs and grow to 36" in their five year life span.

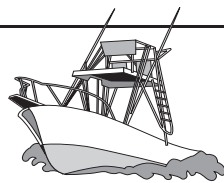

## Underwater Wakulla

Dive season is just getting better.

Hello Wakulla

It's the last day of July 2023 and the dive season is starting to wind down for the out-of-towner who come to enjoy our waters for a few days or even weeks.

For those of us who make Florida our permanent home the dive season is just getting better. The water is a balmy 88-91 degrees while in the deeper water (at 50-feet plus it's down to 85-87 degrees).

On my last dive I told you about the whale shark that we swam with at the Navy Barge. Since then they have reported the sighting of at least four more whale sharks in the different dive sites like the Black Bart, Red Sea, and the Lost Pontoon to name a few. It looks like they may be here for a little while because of the large plankton bloom we are seeing. I recommend you book a dive trip over in Panama City Beach soon and the odds are pretty good you will see one or two of them.

I will say that on my last few dives the water visibility was not the best I've seen, it was 25-35 feet. But I'm sure that as the days go on it should get better.

As we start August we need to understand that the water will become more unpredictable because of the weather patterns farther out in the Gulf. The water will get a little warmer and that could mean some severe weather to start forming. There is also a possibility that it might not be that bad.

There have been dives lately that when we get to the dive site the waves are 1-foot or less but by the time we finish the dive they have gone to 2-foot or more so be very vigilant when you go out into the big water.

The second dive after we swam with the whale shark was the Red Sea. The visibility was about 35 feet but the water temperature was 88 degrees from the surface to about 55 feet then it dropped to about 84 degrees to the bottom.

Both the mother and daughter went on that dive while I observed. They swam all over the wreck until their gas got down to about 1200psi and we headed to our safety stop.

The 3rd and final dive was the Lost Pontoon, it was in about 60 feet of water and the visibility was about the same. That is where they collected a lot of nice shells and sand dollars.

They really enjoyed themselves and I really enjoyed being able to introduce them to the life under the ocean.

Until next week blow bubbles and dive safe.

The complaint stated their tubes popped and they had no other means of getting down the creek. The officers launched a patrol vessel and went to retrieve the subjects. The Bay County Sheriff's Office and Bay County Department of Emergency Services also launched a vessel and responded as well. The officers found four adults and five juveniles stranded on the creek. All subjects were

unharmful and transported back to the boat ramp.

## Weekly Roundup: High school psych out

TALLAHASSEE — Another clash between state education officials and the College Board popped off this week, as the organization said Florida’s restrictions on instruction about sexual orientation and gender identity have “effectively banned” an Advanced Placement psychology course.

The College Board, which develops the college-level courses offered to high-school students, said Florida superintendents were informed Thursday that content in the course violates state law.

“We are sad to have learned that today the Florida Department of Education has effectively banned AP Psychology in the state by instructing Florida superintendents that teaching foundational content on sexual orientation and gender identity is illegal under state law. The state has said districts are free to teach AP Psychology only if it excludes any mention of these essential topics,” the College Board said in a press release.

Gov. Ron DeSantis in May signed a law that bars instruction on sexual orientation and gender identity for Florida students in pre-kindergarten through eighth grade.

Separately, the state Board of Education earlier this summer approved a rule that

requires teachers to follow a prohibition on sexual orientation and gender identity instruction in high school, unless lessons are required by state academic standards or are “part of a reproductive health course or health lesson for which a student’s parent has the option to have his or her student not attend.”

The AP course “asks students to ‘describe how sex and gender influence socialization and other aspects of development.’ This element of the framework is not new: gender and sexual orientation have been part of AP Psychology since the course launched 30 years ago,” the College Board’s release said.

According to the College Board, more than 28,000 Florida students took the AP Psychology course last school year. The 2023-2024 academic year starts as early as next week for some Florida school districts.

The state education department, however, pushed back on the College Board’s assertion that the course was banned.

“Just one week before school starts, the College Board is attempting to force school districts to prevent students from taking the AP Psychology Course. The Department didn’t ‘ban’ the course. The course remains listed in Florida’s Course Code Directory for the 2023-24 school year.

We encourage the College Board to stop playing games with Florida students and continue to offer the course and allow teachers to operate accordingly,” Department of Education spokeswoman Cassandra Palelis said in an email Thursday.

At least one of Florida’s largest school districts has advised parents and students that the course would not be available for the coming school year.

The Orange County school district on Thursday notified the community that AP Psychology “is no longer a potential course option” for students.

The dispute over the AP Psychology course is not the first time DeSantis and state education officials have clashed with the College Board. In January, the state objected to several topics that were proposed for inclusion in an AP African American studies course that was being developed.

The controversy over the African American studies course prompted DeSantis, who is running for president, to say that the state would “look to re-evaluate” its relationship with the organization.

### BATTLE FOR THE BALLOT

Florida Attorney General Ashley Moody this week intensified the legal battle to keep a proposed constitutional amendment that would authorize recreational use of marijuana off the

ballot in 2024.

In a brief filed Wednesday, lawyers for Moody said the measure “misleads” voters in a way to benefit the state’s largest medical-marijuana operator, Trulieve.

Tallahassee-based Trulieve has contributed all but a fraction of the nearly \$40 million raised by the Smart & Safe Florida political committee for the proposed “Adult Use of Marijuana” initiative, which would go on the 2024 ballot.

Attorneys representing Moody, the Florida Chamber of Commerce and the Drug Free America Foundation have filed briefs arguing the Supreme Court should reject the proposal.

Moody’s office argued in Wednesday’s brief that the measure would help Trulieve continue its dominance in Florida’s legal cannabis market.

“This carefully curated ballot summary misleads in ways that, though sometimes subtle, are likely to influence voters — and to do so in a way that entrenches the sponsor’s monopolistic stranglehold on the marijuana market to the detriment of Floridians. The initiative should be stricken,” state Solicitor General Henry Whitaker wrote in the brief.

Trulieve defended the proposal, which has drawn briefs in support from the American Civil Liberties Union of Florida, the Florida Medical Marijuana Business As-

sociation and the Cato Institute.

“The ballot language is clear, states the chief purpose of the amendment and — without a doubt — covers one and only one subject. For these reasons, we trust the court will agree that the voters of Florida should have the opportunity to vote to allow adults in Florida the freedom to use cannabis for their personal consumption,” Trulieve said in a statement Wednesday.

The proposal needs ultimate approval from the Florida Supreme Court. Under the Florida Constitution, ballot initiatives must not be confusing to voters and address a single subject.

### EXIT STRATEGY

As homeowners continue flooding into the state-backed Citizens Property Insurance Corp., regulators this week approved proposals that could lead to private insurers pulling as many as 184,000 policies from Citizens starting in October.

The move came after Citizens last week hit a total of 1,345,403 policies, compared to 486,773 at the end of July 2020.

Insurance Commissioner Michael Yaworsky signed orders Monday approving the proposals by Slide Insurance Co., Safepoint Insurance Co., Southern Oak Insurance Co., Florida Peninsula Insurance Co. and Monarch National Insur-

ance Co.

Slide received approval to assume as many as 100,000 Citizens policies, by far the largest amount, according to the orders posted on the state Office of Insurance Regulation website. Safepoint could take as many as 30,000 policies; Southern Oak, 25,000 policies; Florida Peninsula, 19,000 policies; and Monarch, 10,000 policies. Each could start pulling policies from Citizens on Oct. 17.

Florida leaders have long sought to shift policies from Citizens into the private market, in part because of financial risks if the state gets hit by a major hurricane or multiple hurricanes.

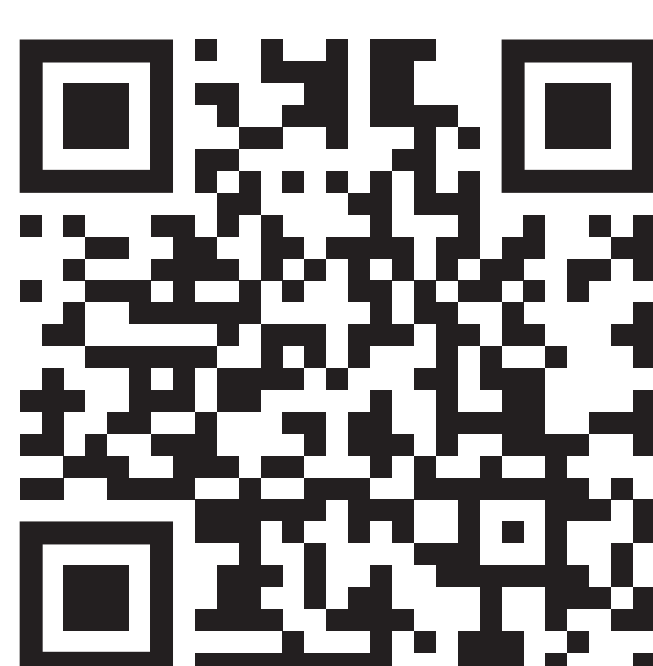

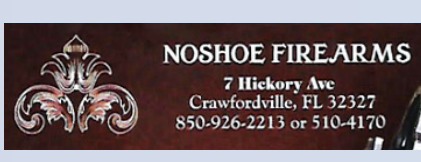

## School bus safety for bus riders

Many students take the bus to school twice a day, five days a week. Approximately 26 million elementary and secondary school children ride school buses daily in the United States, and the U.S. Department of Transportation says more than 50 percent of all K-12 students in the country ride yellow school buses, traveling approximately 4 billion miles each year.

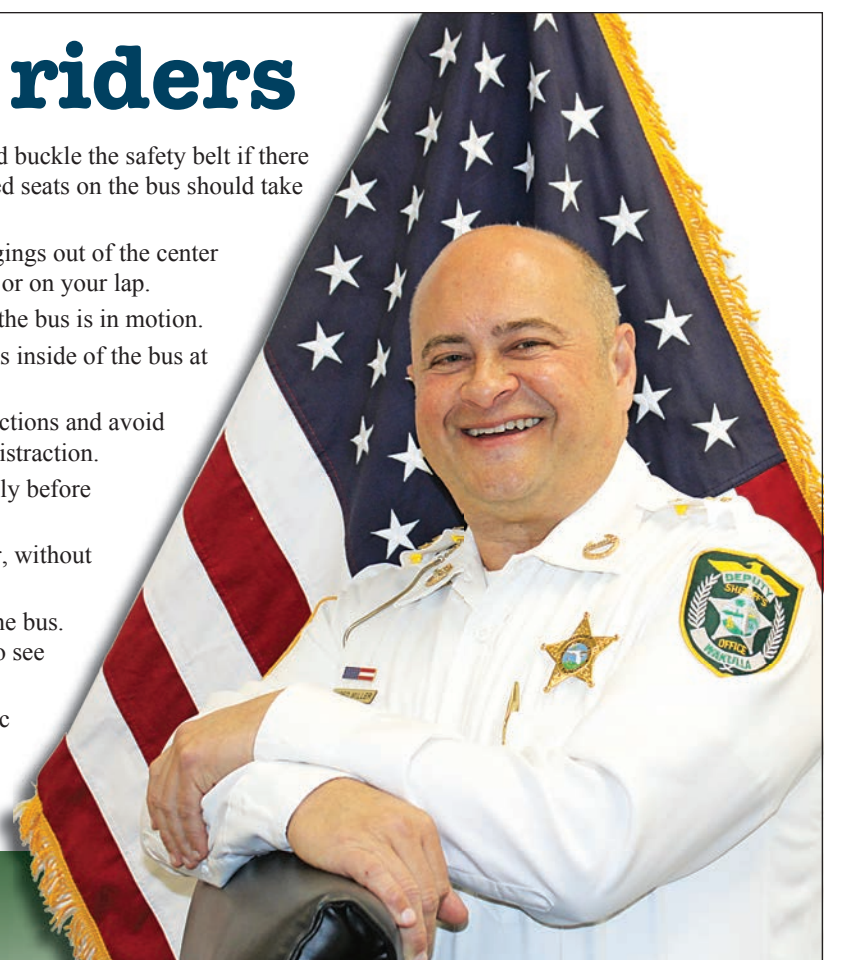
The vast majority of these miles are traveled without incident. In fact, according to the National Safety Council, the national school bus accident rate is 0.01 per 100 miles traveled, compared to 0.96 for other passenger vehicles, which makes school buses considerably safer than other passenger vehicles.

Though school buses are safe, there are other ways to make them even safer. Children, especially those new to school buses, may find the bus fun and unique and not pay attention to simple safety rules.

But parents should take steps to ensure that youngsters always heed the following school bus safety guidelines.

- Wait for the bus in a safe location that is away from traffic, ideally staying in a designated school bus stop until the bus arrives.
- Dress for optimal visibility, especially in inclement weather when it can be difficult for the school bus driver and other motorists to see pedestrians.
- Do not board the bus until it comes to a complete stop. Wait for the driver to open the door, which engages the "Stop" sign for oncoming motorists.
- Use the handrail and enter the bus in an orderly manner.
- Promptly find a seat, sit down and buckle the safety belt if there is one available. Students assigned seats on the bus should take their seat without making a fuss.
- Keep backpacks and other belongings out of the center aisle. Store them under your seat or on your lap.
- Remain seated at all times while the bus is in motion.
- Keep arms, hands, legs, and heads inside of the bus at all times.
- Always follow the driver's instructions and avoid situations that will cause driver distraction.
- Wait for the bus to stop completely before standing up or attempting to exit.
- Exit the bus in an orderly manner, without pushing fellow passengers.
- Only cross the street in front of the bus. It is very difficult for the driver to see students crossing behind the bus.
- Wait for the driver to check traffic before crossing the street and be on the lookout for inattentive motorists.

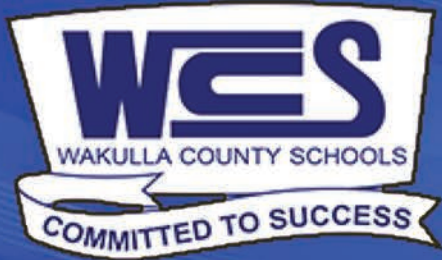

## USE THE NEWS

### 1. THE ONE CARD

Rapper and singer Post Malone may have paid \$2 million for a single collectible card from the game Magic: The Gathering. Last year, he spent \$800,000 on another rare card, but his newest purchase was a one-of-a-kind card of the One Ring from the Lord of the Rings. A dedicated fan of the trading card game, Malone even has had cards made in his honor, like Post the Enchanter. If you were to have a trading card designed based on you, what would it look like? What traits would it have? It could be a picture of you or something important to you. Write a short description and draw a picture of what your card would look like.

### 2. MONKEYING AROUND

Golden monkeys, which live in Brazil's Atlantic forest, were close to becoming extinct with as few as only 200 left in the wild. After years of efforts to save the species starting in the 1970s, a yellow fever outbreak threatened the progress they'd made. After 3,700 monkeys were counted in 2014, there were only 2,500 in 2019. Scientists adapted yellow fever vaccines used for humans and gave more than 370 monkeys shots to protect against the disease. As a result, the population is at its highest level since the '70s with 4,800 monkeys counted. Look up more about golden monkeys, also known as golden lion tamarins, online. Write a summary of what you learn, including what they eat and where they live.

### 3. HOT WATER

With a heat wave hitting much of the world in July, it's not only the land that's seeing effects of high temperatures. Oceans absorb and store heat, raising temperatures of the water at the surface and hundreds of feet deep. Some hot spots have measured more than 100 degrees Fahrenheit, hurting coral reefs off

the coast of Florida and other marine life. What problems could rising ocean temperatures cause, both for the animals and plants that live in the water and those that live on the coasts? Write a short paragraph describing your answer.

### 4. FLY PROBLEM

Around 30 invasive fruit flies from Asia was found in Los Angeles, which

has officials and farmers worried about fruits and vegetables in California. The fly can live on more than 100 types of fruits, many of which grow in the state, and if it spreads, the species can destroy crops and cause farmers to spray more pesticides than normal to protect their farms. Write a short article about why this new species of fruit flies coming to the

US would be a problem for farmers and people who buy fruits and vegetables.

### 5. SOMALIA SCANDAL

A woman made sports news for the wrong reasons after competing in the World University Games in China. The untrained 20-year-old woman finished the race in 21 seconds, which was

almost double the time of the winner for the 100-meter race. As a result, the chairwoman of the Somali Athletics Federation was suspended from her job for sending a woman who is not a runner to compete. Write a short opinion article about why you think people were upset that an untrained athlete was sent to an international competition.

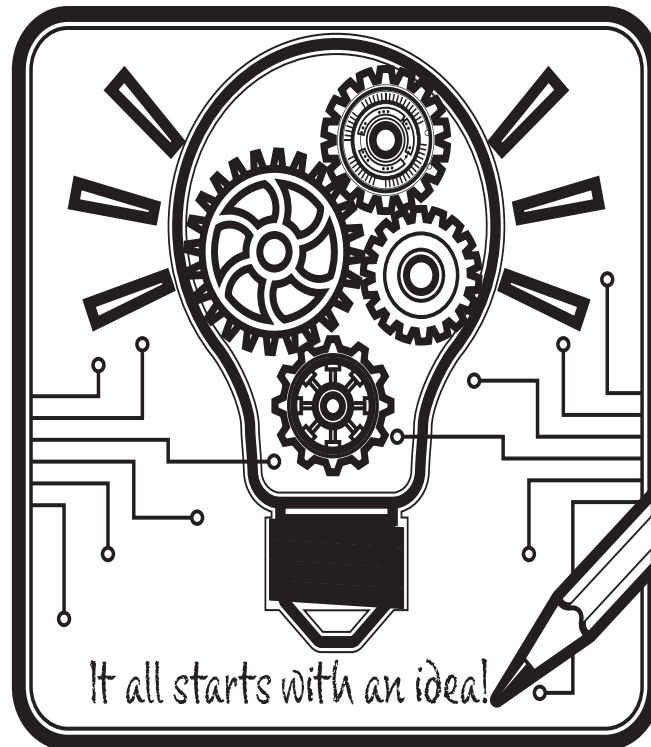

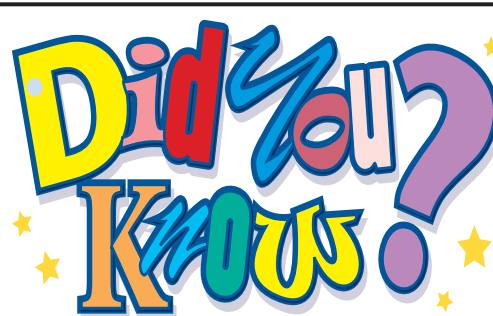

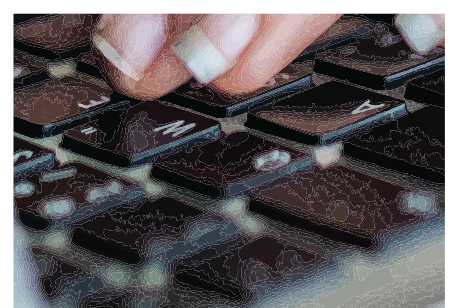
